B-Western Now Offered As A Shooting Category At Monthly Shoots

The following are the rules for the category:

Handguns: All SASS legal handguns are allowed.

Rifles: Any SASS legal rifle of 1884 or later design or a replica thereof (i.e. 1892, 1894, Lightning Rifle, or marlin)

Shotguns: All SASS legal shotguns.

Ammunition: All SASS legal ammunition is allowed.

Leather: Buscadero holster rigs or drop loop rigs. (All of the pistols must be carried below the top of the gun belt.)

All belt and holster rigs must be embellished (fancy stitching, conchos, spots or tooling). All holsters must be of the "Straight Hang" type. No cross draw or shoulder rigs.

Shooting style: Any shooting style at any time (including Gunfighter).

Clothing: Shirts must be of the "B" Western style with snap buttons or any of the following, "Smiley Pockets", embroidery, appliques, fringe or different colored yokes. Shield Shirts are also allowed if it has piping or embroidery. Pants must be jeans, ranch pants, or pants with flap over the rear pocket, keystone belt loops and/or piping or fringe. Pants must be worn with a belt. Suspenders are not allowed. Felt hats only, no straw hats.

Hats must be worn. All boots must be of traditional design with fancy stitching or multi-color fancy design with smooth, non-grip enhancing soles. Lace-up boots and moccasins are not allowed.

Western Spurs with rowels are required for men.

Ladies may wear skirts or split riding skirts.

You must choose at least one or more of the following optional items:

Gloves or gauntlets, scarves with slides or tied around the neck, coat, vest, chaps, cuffs.

All costumes are expected to be fancy and flashy.

The "B" Western costuming must be worn during the entire match and awards ceremony with exception of evening formal occasions. Costumes that depict leading role characters in "B" western movies are allowed as long as the costume is complete with all accessories. Costumes include characters as Hopalong Cassidy, Red Ryder, and Roy Rogers. Any costume that looks Classic Cowboy or military i.e. John Wayne characters and Italian Western characters are not acceptable. All costumes must adhere to the leather, gun ammunition, boot, spur, and hat requirements, listed above.

TEXICAN RANGERS featured in movie, “The Separated.”

Whilst reading the articles in the November, 2005 issue of the Cowboy Chronicle by Chris McIntire and Frederick Jackson Turner, about the movie “Hell To Pay”, I couldn’t help but be reminded about another recent but little known film featuring members of the Texican Rangers in principle roles. But first let me flash-back to the month before I was planning to leave for END of TRAIL 2005. A young lady, Lisa Uncles who turned out to be one of the producers of the movie, showed up at a the Adolph Stieler Ranch during a monthly match of the Texican Rangers hoping to recruit cast members to play Texas Rangers in an upcoming independent film. Interested cowboys were also asked to indicate whether they could provide costumes, weapons, horses and other props. Was she kidding? A chance to play cowboys on the big screen! Where and how soon do you want me to make my mark, little lady? I think the signup sheet was full before the end of the match. We eventually attended screen tests and a number of us Texican Rangers were “hired” on.

The film is entitled “**The Separated.**” Inspired by true events, it is an adventure about two brothers in the mid-1800s who are separated at childhood during a Comanche raid on their family’s farm. Michael Miller, a German immigrant, brought his wife Hester and his entire family to homestead in central Texas near the town of Llano. The film opens on a peaceful early morning in 1850 at the Miller farm that is suddenly shattered by the war cries of a Comanche raiding party. The Comanche it seems often sought young prisoners and this attack appeared to be for that very purpose. The two Miller sons, Billy and Jeff, survived the massacre. Jeff was captured by the Comanche and reared by the tribe to become a warrior. Billy was rescued by a posse of Texas Rangers and reared by the major landowner in Llano. Ten years later, a surprise encounter between the brothers drives Billy to attempt rescuing Jeff from the Comanche. Then Billy uncovers the dark secret underlying the true reason for the murder of his family and his separation from his brother. The movie climaxes in a fateful battle between the Texas Rangers and Comanche.

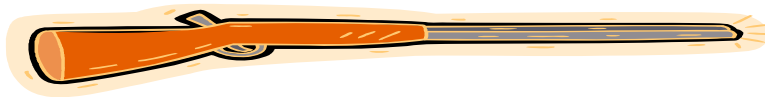
I was chosen to play the part of Michael Miller and the lovely Miss Ina plays my wife Hester. Michael went down fighting in the massacre early in the film failing to save Hester (Miss Ina) or Haddy Heard from the same, or worse, fate. Dusty Chambers was brought into Llano to lead the band of Texas Rangers consisting of Handlebar Bob, LW Hannabass, Old Reed, Dusty Lone Star, Quintana, Durango Kid and Calvin N Hobbs. Also included in the cast was El Oso Plata as the proprietor of the Rangers favorite watering hole. Some of the Rangers turn out to be a little on the dark side (pun intended). Conspirator Handlebar Bob is eventually exposed as the keeper of the aforementioned “dark secret,” Dusty Chambers seems to have been duped by the “Bad Guy” and Durango Kid goes “trigger happy.” Unfortunately many of the Rangers pay the price in the final battle scene.

The movie was filmed entirely on location in, and around, Gillespie County, Texas, over the period of five months between March and July 2005. The cast consisted mostly of local residents with no previous film acting experience and that included those of us recruited from the Texican Rangers. But, in addition to acting, we got to contribute to the authenticity of the film given the 1850s setting. Our rifles consisted of Kentuckies, Hawken’s and other “front stuffers” only. The Rangers provided their own weapons (which is entirely authentic in itself) such as Colt’s Pattersons, ’51 Navies, Dragoons and Walkers. And to the credit of the film’s producer, many of the actors in the role of Comanche warriors were actually “full-blooded” Native Americans.

The experience gave me a new-found respect for actors who refer to film-making as work. The many “takes” during the Texas summer were exhausting and often made a 10-hour day seem 20 hours long. Action scenes such as the one in which I fought the Comanche raiders to my death in the beginning of the film, required hours in front of the camera on two separate days to capture a 30-second sequence on film. This was made even more difficult and time-consuming by the fact that the entire movie was shot using a single camera! We devised our own “blanks” for the shooting scenes and assisted in the choreography of the battle action scenes. As a result,

we all wound up not only portraying characters in the film but also helped as technical advisors, wardrobe specialists, stunt men and special effects crew.

Incredibly, what started as a student film with a crew of five, no funding, and a single camera, grew into a small independent feature film that Premiered, appropriately, at the new Stagecoach Theater in Fredericksburg, Texas on October 15, 2005. The Premier was a hoot, complete with antique cars delivering us “actors” to the theater and the traditional red carpet. The local press and a radio station were on hand while the “flashbulbs” (on digital cameras) popped. “**The Separated**” played for two weeks at the Stagecoach Theater and was then held over for two additional weeks at the theater owner’s request to become the 5th top grossing movie in the theater’s one year history. Billed by the *San Antonio Current* newspaper as a “big little movie,” the film also played at the Alamo Draft House in San Antonio, Texas starting December 11, 2005. Other venues for the film are still being tracked. Although the film is unrated, it would certainly have been suitable for the Saturday afternoon matinees of my childhood barely 100 years later. 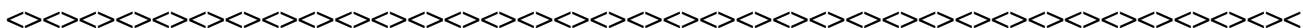

BY- LAWS

Article 1 NAME

The name of the club shall be Texican Rangers, Inc

ARTICLE 2 PURPOSES & POWERS

The purposes for which the club is organized are:

- 1) To perpetuate the traditions, heritage, and spirit exemplified by the dress, firearms, and accoutrements used during the 1860 to 1900 era, which was the essence of the Texas frontier.**
- 2) 2) To function as a cowboy action shooting club which uses firearms of the old west, primarily single action pistols, lever action rifles in pistol calibers and side by side shotguns as well as other firearms of the 1860 o 1900 era.**
- 3) To promote and encourage knowledge of:**
 - a. History of Texas- events, weapons and characters**
 - b. Correct shooting techniques**
 - c. The art of long range shooting**
 - d. Firearm accuracy**
 - e. Firearm safety**
- 4) To gather information from other similar clubs and disseminate this information to members and others having interest in such information and to promote the sport of cowboy action shooting.**
- 5) To engage in other activities consistent with the purpose of the club**
- 6)**

ARTICLE 3 OFFICES

The office of the club shall be located in the city and state were the bank account is held and can be changed by the majority vote of the officers

ARTICLE 4 MEMBERSHIP

Any person who can legally posses a firearm and is over eighteen years of age (unless such person is covered by family membership), may become a member of the club upon payment of the initiation fee and dues as prescribed in the by-laws. Any member application may be rejected for any reason by a majority vote of the current officers.

ARTICLE 5 DUES

Initiation fee for membership shall be \$25. As of January 1 2006, annual dues shall be \$24 payable on or before February 1 of each year. Family Memberships shall be capped at \$48 per year. Annual dues shall be prorated for new members only for joining after February 1. The amount may be changed by the majority vote of the officers with notification being served via the newsletter and e-mails to the membership.

ARTICLE 6 FEES

Fees shall be collected at each shoot as follows: The shooting facility owner requires a fee for any person cowboy shooting or practicing, which will be collected as a courtesy to the shooting facility owner during registration and delivered to the shooting facility owner on the day of each shooting event. The fee schedule will be:

- 1) \$15.00 for any member of the club, spouse or minor child, provided the member is not in arrears on his annual dues.
- 2) \$20.00 for any person who is not a member of the club
- 3) From time to time, the fees may be changed by the majority vote of the officers of the club with notice being served via the newsletter or e-mail fifteen days prior to any shoot. The reasons shall be explained to the membership.

ARTICLE 7 OFFICERS

The officers of the club shall be President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Range Master. All officers elected to serve the club shall serve also as directors for the Corporation for the term of office. The officers will be selected by the vote of the members of the Texican Rangers Club members. The officers shall be in office for a period of one year starting and ending with the April monthly shoot. Official notification of elections must be stated in the January monthly newsletter. Club members may nominate themselves or others and are encouraged to write an article for the February and March newsletters stating their qualifications prior to the election. All officers must be at the monthly shoot one hour prior to the shooters meeting to assist with the shoot. Any officer may remove a person from the property for bad conduct or safety issues. The duties and obligations of the officers shall be as follows: President: this officer shall preside at all meetings and oversee the monthly shoot. He shall coordinate preparations for shooting events, with such preparations to include the placement of sets, props, and targets and the writing of the scenarios to be shot. The range shall be ready for shooting prior to the 9 am shooters meeting and the shoot shall begin after the meeting. He shall have the power to sign checks or make payments for the club. He shall have the power to make purchases for the club such as targets, lumber, office supplies, etc with the majority approval of the club officers. He shall serve as the tie breaking vote when the officers have a vote at any meeting.

Vice President: This officer shall perform the duties of the President and /or Secretary/Treasurer in their absence or at their request. He shall be the receiving officer for any complaint and/or grievance. He shall be responsible to assist the President with the monthly shoot including preparations such as placement of targets, props, sets, and posse sign up.

Secretary: This officer shall assist the acting Treasurer and maintain copies of all correspondence pertaining to the club. He shall notify the officers of meetings and shall notify the members of the club of special activities. He shall take minutes of all meetings. He shall review all applications for membership and review those applications when in question with the officers. He shall maintain a club rooster, record all renewals, and maintain a current waiver for all shooters and visitors on the range. He shall ensure there is someone assigned to handle scoring of each shoot in time for the production of the newsletter. He shall work in hand and be assisted by a newsletter editor appointed by the officers. The monthly newsletter shall include information about the monthly shoot, future shoots, monthly shoot scores, and other information provided by the other members of the club or from club officers. The newsletter shall be e-mailed to the club members by the end of the month. Members without e-mail may request newsletters sent by mail.

Treasurer: This officer shall have the charge of all funds of the club. He shall keep an accurate account of all transactions. He shall render a detailed report at any meeting of the officers when requested at least

fifteen days in advance. He shall post a running financial statement in each monthly newsletter. He shall prepare and file required state and federal tax reports and returns in a timely manner. He shall collect money at the monthly shoot. He shall have the authority to sign checks and/or make payments for the club for expenditures made in accordance with the by-laws. Expenditures over \$100 must have the approval of the President or Vice President.

Range Master: This officer shall oversee the procurement of consumable supplies such as clays, paper/cardboard targets, paint, props, etc. He shall have the authority to order any shooter who refuses to comply with the guidelines to leave the shooting event. He shall have the authority to declare a cease fire at any time. He shall have the responsibility to develop or change current and future stages for the range, oversee the design and construction of future stages. He shall solicit and organize members to participate in work parties.

ARTICLE 8 REMOVAL OF OFFICERS

An officer can be removed by majority vote of the officers for any cause deemed sufficient. Charges shall be filed with one of the officers and forwarded to all other officers. All charges shall be given, stating the facts, and accompanied by adequate evidence or complaints by the members. No action can be taken without the majority vote of the officers.

ARTICLE 9 RANGE RULES

Club safety rules and regulations will be written by the range master and adopted by a majority vote of the officers

ARTICLE 10 MEETING AND VOTING PROCEDURES

A special meeting or vote must be communicated by e-mail or newsletter at least 30 days in advance with notification of the time, date, and subject matter. In case of a vote, a mail in ballot must be included with the notification.

ARTICLE 11 AMENDING THESE BY-LAWS

Amendment of these by-laws may be introduced by any officer of the club. A minimum of four members of the officers must be present.

Majority vote of the members present is required to pass a amendment. The Secretary or his designee must be present and record the proceedings of the meeting for the monthly newsletter

ARTICLE 12 ADOPTION OF THESE BY-LAWS
