## **September 11 Match** by Lassiter:

The *Rangers* are back to the numbers of the mid-1990’s when the *Texicans* were one of only a small handful of Cowboy clubs in Texas. Shooters wanting to be part of the Cowboy experience drove from all over to ‘play the game’. In 2004, there are numerous CAS clubs right around the corner and each town has several clubs for folks to pick from. In our area, there are 5 within a short drive. A record-breaking 97 shooters enjoyed a great day at *Stieler Ranch* for the regular September monthly shoot. The *Rangers* are growing and now have 183 members with more guests excited to come join the fun.

Special recognition must be given to all of you that came “dressed true Cowboy style”. The color and period display contributed to the special feeling of re-creating the image of the ‘*Old West*’. Thanks to each of you for dressing up “Big Time” - let’s keep it going.

Many of you wondered what happened to the OLN (Outdoor Life Network) photographic project. I had passed on information I had last week. Unfortunately, the project turned out to have a different focus. I was disappointed with the communication and then the intent. OLN did come but, not until after 4:00 p.m. when most shooting was over and folks were returning home. As it turned out, they just photographed our Range buildings.

Special recognition must go to *Dirty Dog Dale* and *Woody Duit* for sprucing up the range. *Dirty Dog* was at the range for 2 days to mow the range and paint targets fresh for Saturday’s shoot and OLN expected visit. *Woody* worked Friday to set up targets and prepare Stages for the scenarios.

Saturday’s shooters enjoyed a break from some of the work associated with running the posses. Shooters participating in the “Top 10 Posse” worked as Timers and Score Keepers allowing each posse more time to just enjoy the shoot. In the afternoon, those “Top 10 shooters” had an opportunity to shoot as a group. Shooting as a group never happens on regular monthly shoots for these folks. The Rangers don’t “stack Posses” or have “closed click posses” – we break up Officers and experienced shooters to help with all the posses. Therefore these 10 shooters have never had the opportunity to shoot together. All other members can sign up and shoot with whomever they want each month – not so for that group. They contribute so much work to running the club without many of the benefits, so it was time to make some provisions. Some folks referred to this group as “Super Posse”. The term “Super” certainly applies to this group, but not in the way you might think. Yes, they are great shooters, but more importantly they are “Super” people. They worked all morning for others, getting tired, taking the edge off their own shooting, and then competing in intense heat late in the afternoon when others were enjoying some Air-Conditioning. They also had to clean up the entire range after their shoot.

“Spirit of the Game” is very prevalent at the *Texican Rangers*. We have some of the finest and nicest people in our club anywhere. The support group that comprises the core of the club is expanding constantly and the club continues to be a better place to shoot and enjoy friendships. It’s an extreme pleasure to be part of just a great organization.

## **Book Collecting** by Jonah Stark

Most of us cannot afford all the firearms that we would like to have. Even the firearms we have don't get used a great deal due to the limited areas available to safely shoot. And hunting in far away places is out of the question. Heck, even deer hunting in Texas is beyond the reach of most of us.

Well, there is an out that we can afford, collecting books on hunting, shooting, reloading and other outdoor pursuits. Having a large reference library allows us to retreat into areas we can't always pursue. Over the years, I have managed to amass a library of books relating to shooting and hunting that totals 547 books. Many are hard bound and many are softbound, and they have all been well used by me over the years. The above number does not include many more books on Amateur Radio, Archery, wood working and metal working. I don't even throw away past issues of gun magazines.

My library of reloading manuals and related books alone totals 142. Why? So I can research almost any cartridge that one might come up with that he wants to reload. A friend once came to me to load for his Father's old 1903 Springfield in .256 Newton. How often do you get that kind of request? He had dies, but that was all. A few days later, he had loaded rounds to fire. One caveat concerning the use of data from old reloading manuals should be mentioned. Those with old manuals may wonder why suggested loads have been reduced over the years. Lawyers? Maybe, but the real reason is the writers of reloading manuals have better pressure testing equipment than they did years ago and many of the old loads listed have been found to be pushing the upper limits of safety. So, know what you are doing if you plan on using old data.

Many times, I see a reference by a gun writer referring to an old article in the Gun Digest. Well, unless it is in volume 2, 3 or 4, I can look it up. And one day, if I live long enough, I'll have those three volumes. I've hunted in Africa with Elmer Keith, in India, Mexico and many other places, all just reading books. I'll never see those places, but I can enjoy the experiences of others who have.

Used book stores are a treasure trove of useful books on many subjects. For years, I carried a small notebook listing my books to try to keep from duplicating one in my library. Now I use my PDA to do the same thing.

So, if you have old books on guns that you don't want, I'll take them and add them to my collection. 'Til next time, shoot straight and keep your head down. *Jonah*

## **"Top 10 Posse"** by Cyanide Kwicken Lethal

Thanks to the "Top Ten" shooters who contributed more than keeping time and help with posse work. *Handlebar Bob*, and no doubt the other top shooters, gave informal clinics or classes at each stage. *Handlebar Bob* used the prior stage as a platform for comments on improving technique and speed. This added a dimension heretofore not experienced on the range. These informal sessions were appreciated and well received by the entire posse. I for one would welcome more shoots of this kind, two, maybe three each year.

It was also a delight, and a learning experience, to observe our top shooters in action. Likewise noteworthy, was the interaction among our top shooters, "*Spirit of the Game*", teaching by example, and it's free.

I recognized the value to the "Top Ten" of shooting on a posse of peers. What I had not anticipated was the value to the rest of us of what amounted to a free Cowboy Action Shooting clinic. Free to us, but a real sacrifice for the "Top Ten". The chosen format fostered such interaction and is laudable. This is yet another example of our leadership and our top shooters giving more than they receive. I am grateful. Next time those of us served by the top shooters should reciprocate by running the stages and mopping up.

## **"Half-A-Hand Henri"** by Pepper Jaeg from *Woman's Outlook* of the NRA, article by Bryce Towsley

As she approached the starting line, a quiet metamorphosis took place. Suddenly this soft-spoken barefoot lady turned into a tiger. When the buzzer sounded, her guns were a roaring blur as she ran through the steel targets with blinding speed, ringing them all with solid hits. When she finished and turned toward the unloading table her face was that of an intense predator. Yet, by the time she got to the table, it had again changed into that of a friendly, middle-aged grandmother. The transformation was a bit confusing. All one could say was, "Wow!". What an introduction to *Half-A-Hand Henri*. One heck of a competitor. The rest of us were just competing for second place.

*Half-A-Hand Henri* was Ladies Traditional World Champion at End of Trail, 2003. Her real name is Heather M. Kresser. Heather has two trade marks when she shoots. First, is her damaged hand, missing her right pinky, that is responsible for her alias. Second, is that she always competes barefoot. Her pistol grips are laser engraved with a three fingered hand on the right grip and two bare feet engraved on the left grip.

Heather has been a state game warden, teacher and is a competitive shooter and recreational hunter. Now retired, *Half-A-Hand Henri* and her husband *Dirty Dan* live in Vermont and shoot in more than 40 matches in 11 or 12 states a year. "It's taken us places we never imagined we would see, and we have met some wonderful people." Heather shoots in the Men's Traditional category back East, and whoops'em. "You learn to shoot in the East and you learn to compete in the West. Out West the competition is fierce." *Half-A-Hand Henri* is now teaching her grandson CAS shooting. You-Go-Girl.

## **Guns Of The Old West** by Quintana

Bout ever' issue of this publication is fine as a Quigley shot on a 1,000 yard bucket. The Fall 2004 issue on stands now covers some mighty interestin' guns and cowpokes. Just what Gene Pearcey, a.k.a. *Evil Roy* ordered and his whole family shoots 'em in CAS competition. Front and rear, the sights are designed for quick acquisition. Great Gun.

Also included in *Guns Of The Old West*, were great articles on "End of Trail", El Paso Saddlery, a special on Western Heroes of Hollywood and a feature on film legend Lee Marvin, Master of the Misadventure. Bad guy actor and real life Purple Heart – shot in the butt Marine, Lee Marvin shared with us memorable roles from Monte Walsh, Cat Ballou, The Great Scout and Cathouse Thursday, Who Shot Liberty Valance, The Professionals and Ben Rumsom in Paint Your Wagon. Marvin was an avid hunter and gun enthusiast. His story is followed by an article on Guns of The Professionals. Nice write up on '97 Winchesters, from Old West reality, to the film and to right now off the shelf.
