If you missed Shindig or just want to shoot it again for fun, we will be shooting the same *Shindig* scenarios the 4th Sunday Match. Stay awhile for the side-matches, including *Fastest Shotgun* and come on out for a cool *Long Range* match under the shade of spreading oak trees at the *Billy Dixon Memorial Range*.

October 30 Fifth Saturday No Whiners Match by Lassiter

Registration 8:00 to 8:30. Shooter's Meeting 8:45 sharp. Shoot Starts at 9:00. Last match of the season. The weather should be cool and we are going to have a blast! The 5th Saturday in October is the last chance to shoot at the *Rangers* this year. We're putting on another popular shoot where shooters move in more realistic ways of an actual *Old West Gunfight*. Everyone is invited but be prepared to keep negative comments to yourself. Any Whining will get you a 30-second penalty – hey, this is a gunfight where the opponent doesn't cut you any slack or give you a time-out. It's all in fun – sort of like cowboy action shooting on Steroids.

Bring any extra guns you have and plenty of ammo. Several of the stages will require 4 handguns. One Rifle and one Shotgun will fill the bill there. If you don't have extra guns, come anyway, just ask a friend to loan you a spare. There will be no re-loading 2 Pistols if the stage calls for 3 or 4 Pistols so excessive slow-down is held in check. Also, keep in mind any movement that is beyond the shooter's ability does not need to be performed. Common Sense will prevail – if you're able to do a move, do it – if you question personal injury or ability, do something close in the spirit of the game. There will be 6 stages, lunch available, and a *Cowboy Clays side match*. This one will be a *Hoot!* Strap on your Guns and come loaded for Bear.

SASS's COWBOY ACTION SHOOTER TV SERIES by Quintana

The Single Action Shooting Society's (SASS) *Cowboy Action Shooter* television series done premiered on the *Outdoor Life Network* September 26, 2004. The 13 week series produced exclusively for OLN will air twice weekly on Sundays at 5:00 p.m. and Mondays at 6:30 p.m., from September 26 through the end of December, 2004.

Cowboy Action Shooter is a weekly half-hour series for and about the sport of Cowboy Action Shooting. The program celebrates America's Western heritage as it follows SASS' national championship shooting program across America and explores the social and cultural activities that surround the sport and its organization's 60,000 members. **Sponsored by the *Single Action Shooting Society***, and presented by *Cimarron Firearms Company*, *Cowboy Action Shooter* not only dives into the competition and social aspects of the nation's fastest growing shooting sport phenomenon, it also takes a behind the scenes look at the famous guns and gunslingers that won the West, both on screen and off. Viewers will also meet the industry's makers and manufacturers and learn techniques from the experts as well as the game's Champions. In addition, *Cowboy Action Shooter* will explore historic sites and incidents and chronicle the nation's deep affection for our Great American West while it travels from competition to competition.

The production will cover the majority of SASS' National Shooting Program including its *seven U.S. Regional Championships*, and *END of TRAIL* World Championship, as well as, the *SASS Family Reunion in Gatlinburg*, Tennessee and *SASS Convention in Las Vegas*. *Cowboy Action Shooter* will also visit the historic locations near the filmed events and treat viewers to the unique features each region has to offer. Gun tests and demonstrations, as well as shooter education and special segments will be filmed on location at *Founders Ranch*, SASS' 480 acre premiere Cowboy Action Shooting facility near Albuquerque, New Mexico. The Outdoor Life Network, OLN, reaches 58 million subscribers on cable systems, DIRECTV and The Dish Network. The first three shows were filmed at the SASS World Championship in April followed by the fourth at the SASS Southeast Regional Championship in Georgia. A new website, www.cowboyactionshootertv.com is dedicated to the show.

"Visual Impact" by Pepper Jacq from *Woman's Outlook* of the NRA, article by Laurie Lee Dovey

Protecting your eyes from potential harm when shooting is critical to long-range health. The type of shooting glasses you choose also can enhance shooting accuracy.

The negative impact of squinting is significant. Squinting can create neck and shoulder tension. In addition, squinting causes headaches and increases fatigue, which hampers focus and concentration.

Impact resistance in safety glasses is critical. The lens material in most protective sport glasses is polycarbonate, which has the highest impact resistance of optical plastics. Protective eyewear usually are rated for impact resistance by the American National Standards Institute (ANSI). An ANSI standard of Z87.1 applies to occupational educational operations or processes where eye and face hazards exist. The standards Z87 far exceed the needs of a shooter – essentially protection from shell ejection or target break up. Further, the lower-level standard Z80.3, is also stringent enough for eye protection while shooting.

Because some studies have indicated that exposure to ultraviolet (UV) light increases the onset of cataracts and other ocular diseases, shooting glasses should provide more than just impact protection, and polycarbonate does just that. It inherently blocks 100% of harmful ultraviolet light.

The chemical makeup of the material itself is what blocks UV light. Regular glass provides approximately 80% protection, while polycarbonate provides up to 99% protection.

Lens material is the initial design element that affects eyewear price and performance. For years, glass, CR-39 (plastic) and polycarbonate (plastic) were the three material most often used in sun and sport lenses. Today, polycarbonate lenses are injected, which dramatically increases the optical quality to a level very close to glass. It is also far lighter and much more strong than CR-39 or glass.

The biggest challenge with polycarbonate is how soft the lens material is. It's not nearly as scratch resistant as glass or CR-39. In most cases, a hard coating is standard on the glasses.

Polarization is a glare – reducing technology incorporated into lenses. It is costly and generally drives up the price of any eyewear product. However, if you wear the glasses for driving, consider polarization for safety.

Many companies now offer prescription options in sporting eyewear. Sport eyewear allows shooters to protect their eyes, enhance their performance and look great.

Shooters should consider brightness and contrast. Brightness is the property of light that makes you squint. Contrast is the property that allows you to differentiate colors and focus on an object. Brightness is controlled by varying the amount of light allowed through the lens, while contrast is controlled by varying the amount and type of color allowed through the lens.

Gray tone glasses, generally the most popular, preserve natural contrast. Gray lenses don't block blue (dark) light, which focuses imperfectly on the retina while scattering in the eye. This phenomenon, called blue blur, is intensified by moisture and dust particles on clear days.

Brown-based lenses (brown, amber, yellow, rose, vermilion) naturally block more blue light and can increase visual acuity from three to ten percent. Blue (dark) light is at the dark end of the visible light spectrum and is the most difficult light to focus, especially as the eye ages. Blue blockers are especially beneficial on overcast days when blue light is prevalent. Brown tones also enhance contrast and the intensity of warm colors – yellow, red and green. When contrast is enhanced, target identity and acquisition are also enhanced.

Tint level (dark or light) dictates the amount of visual light transmission (the light the lens lets in) but doesn't affect glare or protection from UV rays. Visual acuity is somewhat lessened with the darkest-tinted lenses, but in low-light conditions, a lightly tinted gray lens can let in more light than a dark amber lens. Consider models that offer interchangeable lenses and with three or four different lens options if you shoot in a wide variety of situations—from an indoor range to bright outdoor sunlight.

62% of Americans wear prescription glasses. Many have experienced the frustration of trying the limited options available to you to protect your eyes from UV rays and harsh glare. This includes, expensive prescription sunglasses, clip-ons or regular sunglasses worn over your prescription lenses. However, wearing a fit-over sunglass that are not optically correct hinders the performance of the corrective lens and detracts from your vision, rather than enhance it.
