We will be shooting 10 stages Friday and Saturday April 8 and 9. Side matches will run Thursday afternoon, April 7, including several exciting events noted on the flier for *Comancheria Days*. Territorial Governor Report by Lassiter

There is a new *SASS* category effective with *EOT 2005*. "*B Western*" category has specific requirements so check these out in the *Cowboy Chronicle* or *SASS website*. The proliferation on categories insures everyone a chance to shoot the style that appeals to them and a chance to win awards and recognition. Also effective with *EOT 2005* are additional requirements to compete in "Classic Cowboy" so check it out.

Bill Cody - Billy Dixon Buffalo Stampede Sharpshooter Match by Dusty Chambers

The Bill Cody - Billy Dixon Match is set for Sunday, April 3. Starting 9 a.m, registration at 8:30.

There will be 5 categories:

Cody Big Bore Lever, Pistol Duelist	Dixon Big Bore Single Shot, Pistol Duelist
Cody Big Bore Lever, Traditional Pistol	Dixon Big Bore Single Shot, Traditional Pistol
Ladies (<i>anyway she wants to shoot it, Traditional, Duelist, Supported or Not</i>)	

We will use our pistols and shotguns as normal. Rifle will be big bore only at targets up to 125 yards. We will shoot 6 stages with 6 big bore shots per stage, 10 pistol and 4 shotgun.. Pistol targets may be a few feet farther out than normal. 10 second miss penalties. We will use the *Train, Saloon* and *Mission* stage areas. Each stage will be shot a second time each with a different scenario.

Folks that want to shoot and don't have a big bore rifle can make arrangements to borrow or share. If you don't have a friend to share rifles with contact *Dusty Chambers* or *Jonah Stark*. There will be 1st place awards for each category. I am planning to do scores during the match, awards to be presented at end of match. If you share a big bore rifle with someone, the cost of the ammo should be offered. The long range Directors (*Dusty, Jonah*) have extra big bore lever guns and ammo. We need to know before the match if you want to shoot and need to borrow. The cost of the ammo is 25 cents per shot. *Jonah* is cutting some targets into a buffalo shape for us. No afternoon side match planned, but is open for discussion at lunch time. Normal match fees of \$10 for members, \$15 for non-members. Lunch will be served for \$5. Lunch will be grilled sausage with hoagie buns, chips and desert. Ice tea too.

Winter Range 2005 by Lassiter

Vocabulary by Lassiter

Cowboy Action Shooting is a family sport enjoyed by clean-cut cowpokes, scroungy cowpokes, Ladies, and Children. As such, all of us must conduct our conversations with good taste and respect for others. We talk about doing things the “*Cowboy Way*” and hold our lady folks up with respect and dignity. This must be especially true with regards to language.

I might understand an occasional slip after a bad shot happens, but it shouldn’t. The use of 4-letter adjectives does not show some special status - in fact it shows an inability to use proper descriptive words that are acceptable to all. I’ve heard all the words but that doesn’t mean I want to listen to any while conducting my favor sport - especially in mixed company.

One of the elements of SASS rules enforced by our Club pertains to use of profane language. Every Ranger is charged with issuing a DQ to any shooter who uses bad language on the firing line. As president, I will be enforcing that rule at all times – not just on the Firing Line but anywhere on our Range at any time. I ask that every *Texican Ranger* conduct themselves at a high level to favorably reflect on our Club.

“I am John Ford. I Make Westerns” 1895 - 1973 by Quintana

John Ford was one of the greatest and most influential film directors of all time. He was an artist in creating truly American and Western cinematic greats that dealt with the American pioneer experience, depicting the Great Generation dealing with WWII and he was a pioneer himself in dealing with issues of social and racial injustice in America.

Perhaps, if it weren't for *John Ford* our image of *Monument Valley* would be no more than a tourist vista. Thanks to ole *Jack Ford*, most of us share an indelible image of the *American Western Frontier* as exemplified by the red castles and vast expanse of these native lands. This picturesque terra firma was a backdrop to many *classic* western motion picture greats. To these lands, that he considered the most peaceful place in America, *Jack Ford* brought his troop of colorful stock characters, a series of great American stories and a vivid imagination of what the *West should have been*. Many a folk who grew up on “*John Wayne*” *motion pictures* formed beliefs and powerful images of the west based on a good story offered up by a handful of creative and sometimes historical writers brought to life by the artistry of *Jack Ford*.

Born *Sean Aloysius O’Feeny Ford* in Maine of Irish immigrants, Jack was fond of the *Irish or Gaelic* and it was well represented in his films and characters, as was much of our American heritage. John Ford cut his teeth directing Westerns in 1917. What followed were more than 100 films. Not all of John Ford’s flicks were oaters. To a *cowboy action shooter*, the *best* are no doubt Westerns. *Stagecoach* was Ford’s first Western masterpiece that set the standard for most classic Western films, then on. *The Searchers* is ranked one of the top 5 all time popular Western motion pictures. John Ford’s favorite was *Wagonmaster* with *Ward Bond & Ben Johnson*, the basis for *Wagon Train*. *She Wore A Yellow Ribbon* was supposedly *John Wayne*’s favorite Ford Western.

Many an actor is recognized as indelibly associated with John Ford films. Thanks to *Stagecoach*, *John Wayne* stepped out of B-Western roles to become a legend. Among the talented troop of actors Ford put in front of a camera that delivered a persona so natural you felt like you knew them included *Henry Fonda, Jimmy Stewart, Ward Bond, Ben Johnson, Maureen O’Hara*, all Ford favorites. *Harry Carey* was a personal friend and Ford’s early favorite as a lead Western actor. Ford started *Harry Cary Jr.* in a motion picture career of well over 100 films. *Ken Curtis*, a Ford stock actor, became Jack’s son-in-law, could sing like a bird and went on to become *Festus* in *Gun Smoke*. Brothers *James Arness* and *Peter Graves* got their start with Ford. *Lee Marvin, Victor McLaglen* and *Hank “Mose” Worden* portrayed memorable characters associated with John Ford films.
